		To minimise adult-to-adult contact:
		• Parent/carers WILL NOT be allowed to enter the school building and, if they drive, will be asked to remain in their cars or in the car park area at drop-off and collection. The only exceptions to this will be parents with children in our Junior School and the youngest Senior School classes (Senior 1 & Senior 4) and new children trialling in the Junior School (see below). Junior School parents will be asked to line up in a socially distanced manner outside the fire escape door of Room E8 where members of staff will be in attendance so their child can be dropped off and picked up at the appointed time. Similarly, Senior 1 and Senior 4 parents will be asked to wait outside the fire exit to the Gym Hall for drop-off and collection.
		• Parents will be told not to gather at entrance gates or doors apart from in the above circumstances and then only in a socially distanced manner.

		 Clean their hands upon arrival, at the start of each class, before and after eating, and after sneezing or coughing. Be encouraged not to touch their mouth, eyes and nose. Spreading infection due to the school environment		Toilet use will be managed and only one student allowed in at a time. Singing classes will observe all existing government guidelines on group singing. All pupils will be 2m socially distanced from each other at all times. No more than 12 will be allowed to sing at one time (this is below the government guideline of 15). As an additional precaution over and above government guidelines, all students 9 years or over will wear face visors. These will be kept in a sealed plastic bag when not in use before and after the lesson. Acting and Dance classes will also be conducted in a socially distanced way, avoiding any close contact between pupils. All rooms will be well ventilated at all times to reduce the effect of aerosol transmission and doors will be left propped open to avoid transmission on door handles, where fire safety and safeguarding won't be compromised. Bins will be provided in classrooms and other key locations to dispose of tissues and any other waste. The school will ensure that toilets are cleaned twice per day and each group using the school facilities will be assigned a particular area of the school and toilets to ensure that no two hirers are sharing the same space.
Individuals vulnerable to serious infection coming into school		For staff with concerns about coming into the school environment, there will be a risk assessment/discussion to identify the most reasonable approach for the individual taking into account government guidance. Similarly, with pupils, government instructions and guidance will be applied to any decisions. Staff will be allowed to wear any PPE equipment they wish to help them to feel secure whilst executing their duties. Non-essential visitors will not be allowed to enter the building at any time.
